We've all had at least one, and this holiday season a new book is available for friends and loved ones who have the curse of a really bad neighbor. Author-producer Bob Borzotta has been helping bad neighbor sufferers for 10 years, and has put some of his best advice and stories from the front into his book, *Neighbors From Hell*. Borzotta's web site, NeighborSolutions.com, offers general advice, plus specific guidance to members. It has a message board that serves as a global support group for people whose patience is tested by neighbors who make noise, trespass, have bad kids, and create neighborhood nuisances that can make an otherwise nice community unlivable.

Borzotta says radio and television programs are under discussion on the subject, but he's happy to just keep helping people online and through his book. A former *Philadelphia Inquirer* reporter, turned corporate communications consultant, Borzotta contends the increase in neighbor disputes over the years signals the end of the traditional community as we once knew it. People no longer bother getting to know each other around the neighborhood, so seemingly minor issues easily snowball into long-lived wars involving police, lawyers and a whole lot of anxiety.

"Conflict close to home is one of the worst things to go through for many people," Borzotta says, "because our homes are supposed to be respites from the harsh outside world." Many of us, he says, choose our communities poorly, don't know how to properly address issues with neighbors, and don't understand the legal and political systems enough to make them work for us.

The result, according to Borzotta, is that bad neighbors are increasingly able to win battles against the "good guys," sending better neighbors out of communities with a growing sense that "neighbor" should be a four-letter word. With *Neighbors From Hell*, Borzotta aims to reverse that trend permanently.
